49 CFR Part 391.11 QUALIFICATIONS OF DRIVERS.

(a) A person shall not drive a motor vehicle unless he is qualified to drive a motor vehicle. Except as provided in 391.63, a motor carrier shall not require or permit a person to drive a motor vehicle unless that person is qualified to drive a motor vehicle.

(b) Except as provided in Subpart G of this part, a person is qualified to drive a motor vehicle if he:

(1) Is at least 21 years old;

(2) Can read and speak the English language sufficiently to converse with the general public, to understand highway traffic signs and signals in the English language, to respond to official inquiries, and to make entries on reports and records;

(3) Can, by reason of experience, training, or both, safely operate the type of motor vehicle he drives;

(4) Can, by reason of experience, training, or both, determine whether the cargo he transports (including baggage in a passenger-carrying motor vehicle) has been properly located, distributed, and secured in or on the motor vehicle he drives;

(5) Is familiar with methods and procedures for securing cargo in or on the motor vehicle he drives;

(6) Is physically qualified to drive a motor vehicle in accordance with Subpart E-physical Qualifications and Examinations of Part 391;

(7) Has a currently valid Commercial Motor Vehicle (CMV) operator's license issued only from one State or jurisdiction;

(8) Has prepared and furnished the motor carrier that employs him with a list of violations or the certificate as required by 391.27;

(9) Is not disqualified to drive a motor vehicle under the rules in 391.15;

(10) Has successfully completed a driver's road test and has been issued a certificate of driver's road test in accordance with 391.31, or has presented an operator's license or a certificate of road test which the motor carrier that employs him has accepted as equivalent to a road test in accordance with 391.33;

(11) Has taken a written examination and has been issued a certificate of written examination in accordance with 391.35; or has presented a certificate of written examination which the motor carrier that employs him has accepted as equivalent to a written examination in accordance with 391.37; and

(12) Has completed and furnished the motor carrier that employs him with an application for employment in accordance with 391.21.

49 CFR Part 383.51 DISQUALIFICATION OF DRIVERS.

(a) General. A driver who is disqualified shall not drive a CMV. An employer shall not knowingly allow, require, permit, or authorize a driver who is disqualified to drive a CMV.

(b) Disqualification for Criminal Offenses.

(1) General Rule. A driver who is convicted of a disqualifying offense specified in paragraph (b) (2) of this section is disqualified for the time specified in paragraph (b) (3) of this section, if the offense was committed while operating a CMV.

(2) Disqualifying Offenses. The following offenses are disqualifying offenses:

(i) Operating a CMV under the influence of alcohol or a controlled substance as defined under section 102 (6) of the Controlled Substances Act [21 U.S.C. 802 (6)], including all substances listed in Schedules I through V of 21 CFR Part 1308, as they may be amended from time to time. Schedule I substances are identified in Appendix D of this subchapter and Schedules II through V are identified in Appendix E of this subchapter;

(ii) Leaving the scene of an accident involving a CMV;

(iii) A felony involving the use of a CMV, other than a felony described in paragraph (b) (2) (iv) of this section; or

(iv) The use of a CMV in the commission of a felony involving manufacturing, distributing, or dispensing a controlled substance when defined as any substance under section 102 (6) of the Controlled Substances Act [21 U.S.C. 802 (6)] including all substances listed in Schedules I through V of 21 CFR Part 1308, as they may be amended from time to time. Schedule I substances are identified in Appendix D of this subchapter and Schedules II through V are identified in Appendix E of this subchapter.

(3) Duration of Disqualification for Criminal Misconduct. (i) First offenders. A driver is disqualified for one year after the date the driver is found to have committed an offense described in paragraphs (b) (2) (i) through (b) (iii) of this section, provided the vehicle was not transporting hazardous materials required to be placarded under the Hazardous Materials Transportation Act (49 U.S.C. App. 1801-1813).

(ii) First offenders transporting hazardous materials. A driver is disqualified for three years after the date the driver is found to have committed an offense described in paragraphs (b) (2) (i) through (iii) of this section, if the vehicle was transporting hazardous materials required to be placarded under the Hazardous Materials Transportation Act (49 U.S.C. 1801-1813).

(iii) First offenders of controlled substance felonies. A driver is disqualified for life after the driver is found to have committed an offense described in paragraph (b) (2) (iv) of this section.

(iv) Subsequent Offenders. A driver is disqualified for life after the date the driver is found to have committed an offense described in paragraphs (b) (2) (i) through (b) (2) (iii) of this section, if the driver has been found to have previously committed any offense described in paragraphs (b) (2) (i) through (b) (2) (iii) of this section.

(c) Disqualification for Serious Traffic Violations.

(1) General Rule. A driver who is found to have committed a disqualifying offense specified in paragraph (c) (2) of this section, is disqualified for the period of time specified in paragraph (c) (3) of this section, if the offense was committed while operating a CMV.

(2) Serious Traffic Violations. The following violations are disqualifying offenses:

(i) Excessive speeding;

(ii) Reckless driving, as defined under State or local law; and

(iii) A violation of a State or local law relating to motor vehicle traffic control (other than a parking violation) arising in connection with a fatal traffic accident. (Serious traffic violations exclude vehicle weight and vehicle defect violations.)

(3) Duration of Disqualification for Serious Traffic Violations. (i) Second violation. A driver is disqualified for 60 days if, during any three year period, the driver is found to have committed two serious traffic violations.

(ii) Third violation. A driver is disqualified for 120 days if, during any three year period, the driver is found to have committed three serious traffic violations.
